Institution Supplement

1. **PURPOSE:** To establish procedures by which inmates may seek permission to marry at the Federal Detention Center (FDC), Honolulu, Hawaii.

3. **STANDARDS REFERENCED:** None

4. **PROCEDURE:**

a. **Request Procedure:**

A federal inmate confined in a Bureau of Prisons institution who wants to get married shall submit an Application for Permission to Marry (Attachment 1) to the inmate's Unit Team. The Unit Team shall prepare a written report of the team's finding, and its recommendation shall be forwarded to the Warden for a final decision.

A pretrial inmate may request permission to marry in accordance with the provision of national policy and this local supplement; however for pretrial inmates, Unit Team shall contact the Court, U.S. Attorney, and in the case of an alien, the Immigration and Naturalization Service, to advise of the marriage request and to request their comments.

Upon receipt of the Application for Permission to Marry, the counselor will request the prospective spouse to send a letter and Spousal Information form (Attachment 2) to the Unit Team with the following information: name, address, telephone number, social security number, length of relationship, documentation of divorce resulting from a prior marriage(s) (Court papers), and a clear statement of intent to marry.

Inmates in pretrial status will be advised that movement to their designated institution will not be postponed or

delayed pending request for marriage.

When the investigation and assessments are completed, the application, with all supporting documentation and the Unit Team Recommendation form (Attachment 3) will be forwarded to the Warden through the Case Management Coordinator, Captain, and Associate Warden, Programs for approval. The packet should include a memorandum for the Warden's signature which outlines the final arrangements for the wedding, such as time, place, approved visitors, etc.

b. Licensing Procedure:

The Marriage Officiate and State Licensing Agent must submit an Authorization for Release of Information NCIC Check form (BP-S660.012) to the Unit Team. The intended spouse and witnesses to the marriage ceremony must submit Visitor Information forms (BP-S629.052) to the Unit Team.

Hawaii State law requires that both the intended bride and groom be present for the state licensing process. It is incumbent upon the inmate and the intended spouse to ensure that they have met all State of Hawaii requirements. The Unit Team will assist the inmate in arranging a special visit during normal visiting hours with the prospective spouse and the State Licensing Agent to facilitate the completion of the marriage license application.

Upon completion of the license application, the Licensing Agent will issue a marriage license. Inmates will not be allowed to pay the Licensing Agent. The prospective spouse in the community will be responsible for paying all costs associated with the license and marriage ceremony. If both parties wishing to marry are inmates, a family member in the community may pay all costs associated with the license and marriage ceremony. The inmate and prospective spouse are responsible for providing the State Licensing Agent with the required legal documents necessary to obtain a license (e.g., proof of divorce, age, death certificate, etc.)


c. Marriage Ceremony:

All marriages occurring at FDC Honolulu will be held in the visiting room during non-visiting hours. Marriages will be scheduled two times a year, April and October, and ordinarily approved by the Warden 45 days prior to the scheduled ceremony. Marriages will be supervised by the respective Unit Team.

No more than two witnesses from the immediate family, in addition to the intended spouse may participate in the marriage ceremony. The Unit Team will prepare NCIC clearances for the above outside participants and submit the request to the Captain for review. Upon completion of the ceremony, the ring will be immediately recorded on the BP-383, Inmate Personal Property Record.
